

## English

The children will listen to the story of 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. They will think of alternative problems and resolutions for the story and act these out. The children will then write an innovated version of 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' story.

The children will look at the life of Grace Darling and learn how to sequence historical events, box up information and facts in order to write a diary about Grace Darling.

## Maths

The children will be learning to count on and back to 100 from any number. They will work out one more and one less than a number. The children will be solving addition and subtraction problems including empty box problems. Using number lines and hundred squares they will work out ten more and ten less. The children will solve multiplication and division problems using objects, pictures and arrays.

## Project:

Engage: Listen to the story of the Lighthouse Keeper.  
End Product: Write a diary as Grace Darling.  
Visit from Hamble lifeboat

### Science:

We will be investigating materials that float or sink and building a boat with suitable materials. The children will conduct their experiment, finding out if the materials that they have chosen to build the boat will float or sink and explain why.

### History

The children will be learning about the life of Grace Darling and her heroic actions. They will find out about the importance of lifeboats today.

## Other learning opportunities:

DT- The children will be making baskets for the Lighthouse Keeper's picnic.

The children will design and make a boat.

Computing - The children will insert images and text to create a shopping list.

PSHE - The children will be thinking about feelings e.g. proud, worried, angry and jealous. They will discuss how to deal with these feelings.

PE - Children will continue to develop the skills of balance, coordination and agility.

RE - Exploring the stories that Jesus told and how they help Christians learn.
